The Executive Director of Nigeria Arabic Language Village, Ngala. Prof. Ibrahim Muhammad has been Six Month in office. The president of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, His Excellency President, Muhammadu Buhari GCFR, approved his appointment as the Director/Chief Executive Officer of the Nigeria Arabic Language Village Ngala, (Inter University Center for Arabic Studies) Borno State. This was contained in a presidential press release dated 16th March, 2021.

With this appointment, Professor Muhammad became the fourth substantive Director, Chief Executive Officer of Nigeria Arabic Language Village, Ngala. He assumed office on 26th April, 2021. Professor Muhammad on assumption to office set the ball rolling by initiating the policies for development of the village. His coming, coincided with the constitution of a presidential visitation panel to the village. The visitation panel was in the village for about two months. The panel interacted with all categories of staff and now a waiting for the release white

paper from the government.

The Director also received the 5th council and conducted the 57th regular meeting with them on 18th and 19th August, 2021. In another move to ensure good relationship with regulatory agencies, Universities and Colleges of Education offering Arabic studies, the village signed MoU with some of these institutions for collaboration and training.

The Chief Executive officer equally, introduced for the first time in the history of the village working through committees for easy policy making and wider consultation.

These committees were established, inaugurated and have begun their assignments. The entire staff were elated by working through committees.

Many policies and initiations with a view to carrying all staff along and boost their morale in the discharge their responsibilities, efficiently and effectively have been introduced by Prof. Ibrahim Muhammad in his six month in office.

Mandate of the NALV

The Nigeria Arabic Language Village Ngala, was designed to cater for 300 level students of Arabic courses in Nigerian Universities, Colleges of Education and Secondary Schools, as well as proficiency students from the public and private sectors of the economy and students of traditional schools, besides university researchers and other general researchers.

The intent was among other things, strongly to supplement the curricula of the said institutions, through enabling the beneficiaries of the Village facilities to use Arabic as a vehicle for written and oral communications.

Thus, by the time students leave the premises of the Village they should be in a position, depending upon their respective categories and pre-Village exposure to Arabic Language:

- Speak Arabic with fluency.
- Acquire proficiency in Arabic.
- Be reasonably competent to write in Arabic.

- Translate to and from Arabic with reference to English and the relevant Nigeria Languages
- Acquire knowledge of the literature, culture and civilization of the Arabs in a simulated social, cultural, physical and psychological environment, which emphasizes linguistic and cultural immersion.

The programmes of study in the Village are targeted towards the following categories of students:

(1) University Undergraduates

Undergraduates are taught based on the syllabus approved by the National Universities Commission in its Benchmark Minimum Academic Standards (BMAS). The Village however, places some special emphasis on the linguistic competence aspect so as to enable the beneficiaries to use Arabic competently as a vehicle of communication. Among other things, they will take intensive courses in Language Drills, Dictation, Composition, Comprehension and Debates. The Village also grooms them to be more

effective teachers, avid researchers and potential erudite scholars.

(2) Students of Colleges of Education

Students Colleges of Education have had some exposure to Arabic and are involved in the teaching of the language in the new Primary Education System. Some will, however, continue to be teaching in secondary and even tertiary institutions someday. They need to have a solid base in the language.

(3) Students of Secondary School

Selected students of secondary schools need to be appropriately exposed to the inner workings of Arabic, since a good number of them will be potential university students, while others might go to Colleges of Education.

With careful guidance, this can greatly enhance and improve the teaching of Arabic across the board.

(4) Proficiency Students

Candidates from both the public and private sectors enrolled for proficiency courses at the Village are grouped into Beginner, Intermediate and Advance Categories. Each category of students is given an appropriate training.

(5) Students of Traditional Schools

Student of traditional schools have acquired a lot of skills in reading and translating Arabic materials into their native tongue, but often have no skills in using Arabic as a vehicle of communication. The village assists them to acquire that oral communication skill.

NALV Governing Council Appoints Ag. Registrar, Bursar

The Governing Council of Nigeria Arabic Language Village in its 57th Council Meeting held between 18th and 19th August, 2021 approved the appointments of Alhaji Ali Abdullahi Ali and Usman Jibrin Kaira as Ag. Registrar and Ag. Bursar, respectively.

The Governing Council is the highest decision making body in the Village. The Chairman and members are constituted by the President and Commander in Chief and it is responsible to the Honorable Minister of Education. The President is the Visitor to the Village. The Council, has among other the responsibility for critical policy formulation among other roles. It is the statutory employer of personnel of the institution. It is not expected to be involved in the day-to-day running of the Village, which is vested in the management headed by the Director/CEO.

The appointments of the two principal officers were as a result of the expiration of the tenure of the substantive Registrar, Mal. Tahir Musa and Bursar, Usman Yakubu Garba on 15th September, 2021.

Until his new appointment, as Ag. Registrar, Alh. Ali Abdullahi Ali was the Deputy Registrar, Students' Affairs of the Village. He was born in Geidam on 2nd December, 1964. A native of Jere Local Area, Borno State. He holds a B.A. Ed (Islamic Studies) and Master's Degree in Strategic Studies. He is a Fellow of Institute of Disaster and Safety Sciences, Fellow Institute of Public Diplomacy and Management, Member Institute of Management (MNIM)

and Member, Teachers' Registration Council of Nigeria.

The Ag. Bursar, Mal. Usman Jibrin Kaira was born on 13th July, 1975 in Maiduguri. A native of Baga town in Kukawa Local Government Area, Borno State. Before his new appointment, he was Chief Executive Officer (Accounts) heading the Pension and Gratuity Unit of the Village. He holds a Bachelor Degree in Accounting from the University of Maiduguri and Higher National Diploma in Business Management from Ramat Polytechnic, Maiduguri. An associate member of the Institute of Certified Public Accountants of Nigeria (CPA) and also a member Certified National Accountants of Nigeria (CNA) from the Association of National Accountants of Nigeria (ANAN) awaiting induction.

A Summary on the Visitation of the New NALV Director

The NALV Director Prof. Ibrahim Muhammad paid a Courtesy visits to Private and Public Universities and Colleges of Education offering Arabic course across Nigeria.

President Muhammad Buhari GCFR deserved our support and prayers for appointing this multi disciplinary and multilingual professor, a most visionary and programmatic scholar of the village ever had.

Ever since he was appointed as the Director/CEO of the village he has never spent a week in his house with his family. He has been going round places with a view redeeming the lost glory of the Arabic Village. He has so far visited 16 Universities and 32 Colleges of Education offering Arabic Across Nigeria, all with a view to reclaiming the mandate of the Arabic village to take its rightful position.

The Immersion and Acculturation programmes by law are statutory responsibility of the Village. However due to the prolong insurgency that has engulfed Borno State and the North East, the programme are illegally carry away. The acculturation programme by some Universities and College of Education have been suspend hiding under the canopy of the insecurity to justify their none attendance of immersion programme in the village.

With understanding the circumstances under which mandate of the village are taken away by some Universities and Colleges of Education offering Arabic, the Director has taken the challenge upon himself in other to put a stop to the wrongs being perpetuated by some Colleges of Education into the right perspectives. And at the same time He was vigorously pursuing the Universalities that are not coming, telling the VCs of those Universities that there is tremendous improvement in the security situation in Borno State and the North East in general. In view of this development, professor Ibrahim Muhammad has called on concern institutes to start sending their 300 level student of Arabic for the immersion programme. In all the places He visited so far, there are positive responses and promises were made for further compliance with the provision of the law for attending the immersion programmes by the Universities and Colleges of Education.

NALV Director/CEO, Professor Ibrahim Muhammad in continuation of his nationwide tour of Universities and Colleges of Education offering B.A and NCE Arabic in Nigeria, on 25th August, 2021 paid a courtesy visit to the Vice Chancellor of Ahmadu Bello University Zaria (ABU). The members of NALV delegation were received by the DVC Administration, Professor Ahmed Doku Ibrahim, DVC Academics Professor Danladi Amodu Ibrahim, and Prof Yahuza Sulieman of Arabic Department. at the Senate Building .

In his opening remarks, Professor Ibrahim Muhammad went on memory lane and informed the VC that Nigeria Arabic Language Village, Ngala was established in 1992 with a mandate to teach Immersion course to 300 level undergraduate students of Nigerian Universities and Acculturation course for NCE students of Colleges of Education in Nigeria. The Director/CEO also told the VC

that, by law all students of Arabic in Nigerian Universities and Colleges are to come to the village for the compulsory one-year immersion course and 3 months Acculturation programme.

The immersion and acculturation courses are prerequisite for the award of B. A, Arabic and NCE Arabic respectively. The Director had further informed the VC that, due to the activities of the insurgents in the North East, the Acculturation Programme was shifted to some centres within Nigeria. He also told the VC that, now that the insurgency has gradually started coming to an end, the village will very soon start hosting students for both University and Colleges of Education.

According to the Director, purpose for the visit was for the village to tap from the wealth of experiences of the University and guidance as first generation University in the North, in view of that he said, the Village would benefit a lot from ABU.

While responding, the VC, ABU represented by DVC (Administration), Prof. Ahmad Doku Ibrahim thanked the Director for the visit and promised to start sending their students to the village for the immersion programme as soon as the security situation improves. The VC further suggested for collaboration with the Village in the following areas such as; Joint Research, Conferences, Publications and Symposiums. The ABU have further promised to sign an MoU with the Village for effective collaboration and the University is ever ready to support the Village to achieve its goals.

Therefore, the law does not allow or recognize any college of Education to run Acculturation programme. "Doing so amounting to the violation of the law," he said.

Professor Muhammad cited some Colleges of Education, who have been conducting Acculturation programme for their students, an action which he said, contravened the law which says NALV is the only recognized institution to organize the Acculturation programme.

In his response, the NCCE Executive Secretary had told the NALV Director/CEO that, he was not aware of such breach of the law by Colleges of Education. The ES has immediately called on the Director Planning to invite all Provost of Colleges of Education offering Arabic for a meeting with a view to addressing the issue with immediate effect.

The Executive Secretary further commended the effort of the Director, Professor Muhammad for his proactiveness in reaching out to the ES to inform him of this development regarding the violation of the laid down laws by Colleges of Education offering Arabic.

In that respect, Prof. Ibrahim has been going round the country to inform and invite all Universities and Colleges of education to come to the village for the programmes. As it was discovered that some colleges of education are hiding under the canopy of insurgency to conduct the Acculturation programme for their students which is a flagrant abuse of the law establishing the village and it is tantamount to futility. The village is by law mandated to validate the B.A Arabic and NCE Arabic respectively. Therefore, any student in Nigerian Universities or Colleges of Education majoring Arabic language must attend the

village immersion and Acculturation courses respectively.

Professor Ibrahim Muhammad, the Director/CEO from inception to date has so far visited over 30 Colleges of Education and over 16 Universities across Nigeria.

It's hope that his visitation to the universities and colleges of education would in no distance time begin to yield some positive

results Insha Allah. As it has been reported that, in all the places he visited, he was given a positive responses ad assurances, indicating their interest to come for the programme.
