The international world Arabic day is being celebrated all over the world on 18th December every year. The adoption of Arabic by the UN as one of its official languages and subsequent declaration of the International Arabic Day is worthy for recognition. Arabic language is widely written and spoken by hundreds of millions of people across the continents of the world.

The glories of Kanem Borno Empire, which has a history of more than 1400 years using Arabic Language as its official language of communication. The Mais and Shehus of our great empire had excelled in the use of Arabic and promoted its learning thereby facilitating the development of a unique civilization. Arabic is one of the languages of communication among the people of Borno and a sizeable number of its people speak it as a mother tongue.

United Nations Arabic Language Day which is

The date was chosen for the Arabic language. In 1973 the General Assembly approved Arabic as an official UN language, and its arms. The UNESCO thereafter declared 18th of December every year as International Arabic Day, celebrated throughout the world.

## Welcome address by the Director/CEO Nigeria Arabic Language Village, Ngala

The Director/CEO succinctly started with a brief history of the Nigeria Arabic Language Village, Ngala. The NALV was established by the Federal Government of Nigeria in 1992 to offer Language Immersion Program to the 300 Level students of Nigerian Universities offering Arabic language. All Arabic students must attend a mandatory one-year training for the Immersion Programme in the Village and all students of N.C.E. Arabic must attend the Arabic Acculturation Programme of the Village. By law, its not allowed to employ anyone without being certified by the Village. Students come from all over Nigeria to attend the Village. At the peak, we had over 15,000 students but with the insurgency everything came to a standstill. The school was totally razed down, destroyed, levelled to the ground by the Boko Haram. All facilities and infrastructures such as Classrooms, E-library, Clinic, Language Laboratory, Staff Accommodation etc. were destroyed.

Despite the level of destructions, the Federal Government did not relent in its efforts in bringing back the

noticed the community services rendered by the Village towards training teachers of Tsangaya and (Alarammai) including them in its programs through intensive Arabic course.

"The Deputy Governor Umar Usman Kadafur who represented the Governor at the occasion said, Government undertakes to work closely with the Village through the Ministry of Education in identifying out-of-school children and seek the Village to give them proper training. And said, we are looking forward for the Village to establish a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Centre for Ajami and Qur'anic Studies at the newly established Borno State University".

He also said that the government appreciated the condor and determination of the management of the Village towards making the it a Centre for excellence, free from bias, prejudices and favouritism. and make organizations and parastatals to prepare a tangible MTSS for 2020-2024.

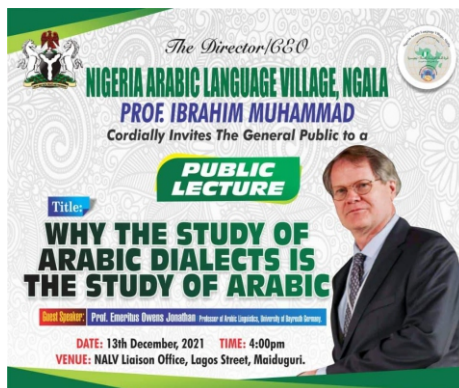
The workshop was aimed at achieving the National development goal of President Muhammadu Buhari GCFR for Education 2030.
